Pinyon Jay Study

Pinyon Jays have historically been understudied as well as suffering significant long-term population declines. To gather information for a rangewide status review, the US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and the East Cascades Bird Alliance (ECBA) are partnering to set up a volunteer monitoring program to help survey for nesting Pinyon Jays in areas within and surrounding Bend, Sisters and Redmond. ECBA volunteers will be trained by USFWS staff to use specific monitoring protocols and in the use of the Great Basin Bird Observatory (GBBO) Mobile Survey App for Pinyon Jay. ECBA and GBBO trained members on the use of this App in April 2024, and since then, our birders have been using it to collect presence and absence data on Pinyon Jays in Central Oregon.

Birders Night on February 20, 2025 will be about Pinyon Jay conservation followed by volunteer training for the surveys that would likely occur in early or mid-March of 2025.
