Lake Creek Lodge Restoration

ECBA had a wonderful opportunity to partner with Think Wild and Lake Creek Lodge a few weeks ago. If you've not been to the lodge, you may want to go check it out. The restoration is remarkable. Gordon Jones had a vision to create an oasis and he has done just that. The riparian restoration along the Metolius River has made this area incredible habitat for migratory birds as well as residents. With some help from Ken Hashagen, Jenny Sharp, and the Black Butte school around 40 nesting boxes for bluebirds and nuthatches were put in a few years back.

It was a beautiful Saturday morning, on world migratory bird day, with around 25 participants of all birding levels, we explored the grounds. "I think everyone expressed how much they enjoyed the program with many saying it benefited them both with increased well-being and increased awareness about birds and habitats.

Gordon and his team provided delicious Sisters Bakery donuts, coffee, tea and bird lists etc. They allowed us to use tables and chairs to create a welcoming gathering and sit area out by the Creek. The Lodge was full

and so we know his staff had to go above and beyond to support us, yet they were all smiling and welcoming no matter what we requested.

We ended up taking three groups around the Lodge grounds and my kids had the accessible nature journaling, meditation, scope, and stationary bird enjoyment area open throughout the event for people to use as needed. Our volunteer guides were incredible - all the participants were inspired and genuinely excited by all they heard, saw, and learned. So many people could not wait to tell me about what they experienced when the groups returned.

Crooked River Wetlands Walks

In 2025, Wetlands Walks will be held on the first and third Saturdays of the month starting in April and running through September. The first walk will be April 5, 2025 and the last walk of the year will be September 20, 2025. We gather in the CRWC Parking lot at 7:45AM. Walks will begin at 8:00AM and conclude at 10:00AM. The walks are approximately 2 miles long and last about 2 hours. There is no drinkable water at this facility so bring water and dress for Central Oregon weather.
